### Come Celebrate Tu B'Shevat at the Synagogue



Tu B'Shevat (the 15<sup>th</sup> day of the month of Shevat) is our celebration of the New Year of the Trees. This special day is sometimes called the birthday of the trees and hints at the beginning of the spring season and holiday cycle. Tu B'Shevat is also an opportunity to explore the ways in which care of the environment and repair of our natural world are Jewish issues. We will observe the holiday with special programming on several days:

#### Friday, February 3 🕸 <u>6:00</u> pm (note earlier time)

This Family Shabbat service, which begins earlier than usual, will be followed by a vegetarian/dairy potluck dinner and special Tu B'Shevat/Shabbat Shirah sing-along.

#### Sunday, February 5 🕸 8:45 am AND 11:00 am

During each of our regular Religious School sessions we will conduct a special Tu B'Shevat seder — a feast of tree fruits and a celebration of the changing seasons — and parents are encouraged to join in the fun.

#### Sunday, February 12 🌣 2:00 - 4:00 pm

Beth Israel members are invited to come plant trees in **Little Squalicum Park** at the north end of Bellingham. Little Squalicum is a former EPA toxic waste site that now needs its plants to be restored — and we will be the first to plant there! Bring the kids and bring the grandparents; Bellingham City Parks will bring the shovels, the gloves, the plants, and the expertise. When we are done with the work, Sisterhood and Brotherhood will warm us up on-site with hot drinks and *nosh*. Maps and directions to the park will be available at Beth Israel prior to planting day.

If you don't feel you can join in the planting, anyone can make a donation toward the purchase of trees and bushes to be planted in the parks. You can mail donations to the synagogue from now until February 12. Please make checks payable to <u>Whatcom Parks & Recreation Foundation</u>, and note "for Bellingham City Parks" in the comment line.

If you are interested in helping restore Little Squalicum Park, it's important to RSVP so there will be enough gloves and shovels. Please let **Barbara Boothby** know by February 5th, by phone or email. Let us know how many you think will be coming, and if you will be bringing any children.



# MESSAGE FROM THE RABBI

The recent snow, cold, school closures, and all-around winter wonderland weather made it a bit hard to believe that the spring cycle on the Jewish calendar is about to begin. But it is. Tu B'Shevat, the

15<sup>th</sup> day of the month of Shevat, which is the New Year of the Trees, announces the arrival of the spring cycle of the Jewish year.

Tu B'Shevat this year falls on Tuesday night of February 7 and Wednesday, February 8. We'll mark the occasion with learning and festivities during Religious School on February 5 and with a congregation-wide tree-planting program coordinated by Barbara Boothby that will take place on Sunday, February 12.

But it's not yet time to put away our skis and snow shovels. Tu B'Shevat does not mean that it *is* spring (at least not in Western Washington). It does announce the beginning of the spring cycle. What this means is that we are about to begin an upward climb, a slight and gradual shifting upwards, an elevation in connection with

#### holiness in time.

The high points of the spring cycle on the Jewish calendar are Pesach and Shavuot, when we remember and celebrate redemption and revelation, liberation from Pharaoh in Egypt and God's giving of the Torah at Mount Sinai. But arrival at the high points of the season takes time; the climb is gradual. We do not get there overnight.

But time has a way of moving quickly. We're in the midst of winter now. But soon it will be spring. So right now, with snowfall and cold winter weather, we are invited to begin to look forward to spring – not to miss the beauty and blessings of the season now upon us, but to begin our ascent that takes us to the high points of "Jewish spring."

Last year's Tu B'Shevat programming included a wonderful evening of making art – projects and creativity for all ages. All of us are invited to stop by Stampadoodle Paper Café to see how Wendy Schwartz has transformed our individual artistic expressions into *(See FROM THE RABBI on page 2)*
