For Marriage Equality to become legal in Washington State, voters will have to **approve** Referendum 74 to affirm the law passed by the state legislature. It will be on the November ballot because opponents collected 240,000 signatures. 80,000 pledges to approve Ref. 74 were collected statewide, and we thank all of you who signed pledges.




