Hurtful words

Nearly 20 year ago, I served as an editor on my high school's yearbook committee. I was specifically in charge of the sports pages, but I also helped with the



overall layout of the book. I remember the painstaking hours of combing through every page to make sure everything was just right -- the align-

ment of photos, the copy, and especially the appropriateness of the senior pages. Each graduating senior received their own full page where they could include pictures and quotes that meant something to them. Being in San Francisco, it wasn't uncommon to find many Grateful Dead, Janis Joplin or other hippie band quotations. The all-time favorite was definitely, "What a long strange trip it's been."

Occasionally, our staff would find something we thought was inappropriate (a risqué photo, for instance) and our adviser would approach the student informing him or her that we would not be including it on their page.

Last month, Lynden High School was confronted with a yearbook situation of their own. Three seniors decided to include Adolf Hitler quotes on their portrait. The quotes themselves are

Faces in our community

Garden inspires *tikkun olam*

A hummingbird hovers over crimson columbines in the Schwartz's garden as if deciding where among the tangle of blooms to land.

Miriam links the scene to Judaism because she considers it her contribution to *tikkun olam*.

"It keeps me in tune with nature," she said. "I try to make the world a better place and this is my way of doing it."

She will share this abundance with other residents of this nature-loving town when she opens it for the annual Whatcom Horticultural Society tour on July 12 and 13.

Visitors can first see a riot of annuals tumble from containers, then continue to behold beds of perennials. Daughter Samantha, 9, points to "secret paths" leading to "rooms." Her favorite has a small pool and stone bench.

As Samantha and Julia, 12, lounge on their deck of weathered wood -- once a greenhouse for orchids, Miriam talks about her life. A family practice physician, she was born in Pittsburgh, spent preschool years in Chicago, moved to Texas, where her father taught organic chemistry at Texas A and M University, then did a residency in Colorado. For the last 23 years, she has lived in Bellingham, where gardening seems ever present with bountiful nurseries and four temperate seasons. It is where she met her husband

Greg, a Bellingham native, on a blind date and married him in 2001. Greg, who has lived in Bellingham most of his life, teaches mathematics at Western Washington University. "I really value the friendships I've made through CBI", said Greg, who is not Jewish. The family has belonged to the synagogue since 2008, Miriam currently serves on the board of directors, and it rates prominently in their daughters' hearts.

Julia calls it "her home away from home." Samantha sees it as "a place where I can understand who I am. In school, there are few Jews, but here I can practice my religion without being looked at."

The girls contribute to their mother's efforts at *tikkun olam*. In turn, the garden inspires them. Julia wrote a vivid description of a garden in her book about the life cycle of the hummingbird: "The view there was always the same, a dripping oil painting, saturated with vibrant purple and green."

tree, one of a few plants with sentimental attachments, was a gift from Miriam's mother, Lee, and her late father Barry.

Miriam has designed the garden by observing others and from her own experience. The first time, she bought plants that appealed to her, then looked up what conditions they wanted. All went well until winter.

"Then everything vanished," she said. "It was all deciduous so I had to add evergreens."

Linda Hirsh has lived in Bellingham for 16 years. She spent 10 years reporting for The Hartford Courant in Connecticut, has two story/cookbooks in print, a chapbook of poetry and another coming out in Summer 2014.

far from inflammatory. What is inciting goes without saying. As of now, no disciplinary action has been taken and the seniors all received their diplomas. The school has communicated that they will review their process of how quotes make it to print. (That's the least they can do!)

What is most upsetting to me about this story is not the fact that there wasn't better oversight or that the principal and superintendent failed to make this incident a teaching moment, or even that the three teens did what they did, but rather the reaction of some Lynden High students and others in the community. One junior said in an interview with Q13 Fox News, "I can see why people would be offended by them, but personally I'm not going to make a big deal about it." Another student said, "As long as (it's) a good, meaningful quote or something." And some comments from readers of the

news website include, "How is this news? Hundreds of kids post Bible verses as their quotes yet you don't see any sort of uproar from the parents of atheist students...Who cares?" And finally, one person wrote, "Just a bunch of 'edgy' teenagers, nothing to see here."

But this *is* a big deal. It *is* news. People *do* care. And there *is* something to see and it's disgusting and offensive. Where is the education? Must every child have a sit down discussion with Noemi Ban and other survivors for it to sink in? Can we count on parents and teachers doing their part as well? This is what is so shocking to me: the fact that some do not understand why many people are upset about this. How is it possible that they do not get it?

These "edgy" teens might not share any of Hitler's feelings towards Jews or blacks or homosexuals...yet. But the seeds of hate are in them and we have to do more as a community to teach what is and what is not derogatory and hurtful to others. While all of us, I imagine, respect

our freedom of speech, there is a line that was crossed and it's our job to inform our youth why there is such a line.

It is sad when we read stories such as this. And even worse when the story is so close to home. Unfortunately this won't be the last time we hear of teens -- or adults for that matter -- doing something utterly distasteful. But we can hope. And we need to hope that change is possible in these individuals. Arguing with them, blaming them, and keeping silent will not solve the problem. We must reach out and attempt to have a conversation.


I pray that someday these men and women will understand the pain they have caused. I pray that they may be able to make *teshuva* for their hurtful actions and for the wounds they have reopened.

May The Holy One continue to create goodness in this world and may we spread this goodness throughout our communities and beyond.


