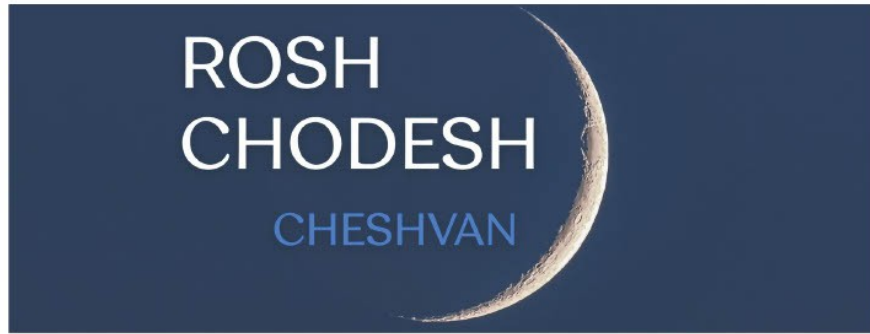

Safety Response Protocols and Quick Guide

The Safety and Security Committee has recently approved and printed a flip chart entitled *Safety Response and Quick Guide*. These guides will be placed in many of the rooms of our synagogue building.

The quick guides provide practical information about actions to take when one is faced with variety of safety problems and emergencies.

The guides cover:

- Medical emergencies
- Holding or securing in place
- Lockdowns
- Evacuations
- Fires
- Earthquakes
- Hazardous materials
- Bomb threats
- Armed subjects

Additionally, the quick guides include a red card/green card method for communicating one's safety status.

Safety Response Quick Guide training for congregation members is scheduled on Sunday, September 7, from 3:00 to 4:30 pm at CBI.
